



The Central Florida Pledge

At the December 15, 2025, City Council meeting, the Oviedo City Council unanimously signed a resolution affirming the City's commitment to the Central Florida Pledge.

By signing the resolution, the City of Oviedo joins the Central Florida Pledge Business Network, a coalition of organizations and leaders dedicated to fostering respectful, inclusive, and welcoming communities across the region.

Members of the Central Florida Pledge Business Network commit to:

- Treating everyone, customers, employees, and vendors, with dignity and respect
- Listening with openness, especially in moments of disagreement
- Creating spaces that are safe and welcoming for all
- Speaking up with courage when it matters
- Taking small, consistent steps to strengthen the community

"We are proud to be the first Seminole County City to adopt this Resolution," said Mayor Megan Sladek. "We want everyone who lives and visits Oviedo to feel safe and exercise their right to free speech."

The Central Florida Pledge was founded as a call to action, encouraging people from all walks of life to come together and choose courage and kindness in building stronger, more connected communities.

WHEREAS, We pledge to keep Oviedo and Central Florida safe all who live here and for future generations.




1. We will lead by example, treating all people with dignity and respect, especially those with whom we disagree.

Citizens Way

At the December 15, 2025 City Council meeting, the Oviedo City Council approved and signed a resolution officially naming the connector road Citizens Way.

The City invited residents to submit potential names for the roadway and received 271 submissions. During a City Council work session, the top suggestions were reviewed alongside the City's road-naming guidelines. After careful consideration, Council selected Citizens Way, honoring the historic Citizens Bank that once served Oviedo's downtown.

Former Citizens Bank employees attended the meeting to thank Council members and share the bank's history. The bank was originally built to serve local residents, who previously had to travel to Sanford for banking services. The three former employees in attendance represented a combined total of approximately 100 years of service with Citizens Bank.

The City is proud to commemorate this important piece of Oviedo's history by naming the connector road after such a meaningful and historic institution.



Oviedo High Volleyball Champ Recognition

The 2025 Oviedo High School Girls Volleyball team had an unforgettable season, representing their school and City with heart, playing one of the toughest schedules in the State.

Throughout the season, the team bond and perseverance grew stronger continuing to fuel their drive for success ultimately leading them to become Conference Champions, District Champions, Regional Champions, and Class 6A State Champions. The resilience and belief in each other showed what it means to play with their heart on their sleeve, put the team first, stay together in the face of adversity, and commit to the program's core values of selfless, tough, discipline, and love.

During the state championship match, the team fell behind two (2) sets to none. Refusing to quit, they battled all the way back to complete a reverse sweep, taking the next three (3) sets in a row against the dominate back-to-back defending state champion powerhouse St. Thomas Aquinas, securing Oviedo High School's third FHSAA State Volleyball Championship.

A CALL To Artists!

The City of Oviedo Public Arts Board is inviting artists to participate in two upcoming public art projects designed to celebrate the City's culture, history, and natural beauty.

Oviedo Boulevard Sculpture Installation

The second project seeks a sculpture for a designated space on Oviedo Boulevard at Center Lake Lane.

The artwork should represent the flora and/or fauna of the City of Oviedo. It may be pictorial or abstract and may feature a single or group representation.

The selected artist will receive a stipend of \$25,000 for design and execution.

Artists are required to:

Provide liability insurance covering the full scope of the project.

Use durable materials suitable for Oviedo's outdoor environment, capable of withstanding heavy rain, hurricane-force winds, sun, and humidity.

Submissions for the sculpture are due by midnight, January 2, 2026.



LOCKWOOD BLVD RESURFACING



We are pleased to announce Public Works Staff is working closely with contractors to coordinate efforts for the resurfacing of Lockwood Blvd. The work has started along the roadway and is expected to last at least one month, barring inclement weather.

Crews will be doing the resurfacing in the overnight hours for less impact on traffic.

Please be aware of upcoming traffic pattern shifts when the work begins.

For the safety of the construction crews, please drive safely through this area. Slow down and follow the lane shifts.

HOLIDAY SAFETY

Our Police and Fire Departments want to remind everyone to practice safety this holiday season. With Thanksgiving, followed by Black Friday holiday shopping, we want to provide some tips to keep you and your family safe this season!



Do not Drink and Drive

Impaired driving can lead to serious injuries or death on the road.

We know everyone wants to have a good time and enjoy the holidays, but please be responsible when it comes to grabbing the keys and heading home or to another location.

If you plan on drinking, please have a plan if you decide to travel:

1. Have a designated driver who will be the sober driver.
2. Plan on using a ride-share such as Uber or Lyft.
3. Leave the keys. If you drove to a location, leave the keys/car until you can pick it up when you sober up.
4. Always use seatbelts if you are the passenger.
5. Think about other drivers. You are a danger not just to yourself, but to other drivers trying to get home.

Christmas Tree Safety



As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.



PICKING THE TREE

- Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.



PLACING THE TREE

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.



LIGHTING THE TREE

- Use lights that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.



After Christmas

Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home.

Check with your local community to find a recycling program.

Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

FACTS

- ! **Nearly half** of home Christmas tree fires is caused by electrical problems.
- ! Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- ! A heat source too close to the tree causes **one in every four** of the fires.

Nationally certified child passenger safety technicians will be on site to assist checking and installing the car seats. This is a FREE service we want to provide to our residents. Please bring your own car seats.

PORCH PIRATES

Porch Pirates can strike anywhere at anytime. They are no longer thieves in the night, but during the daylight hours also. These thieves approach homes across are area to steal packages you've ordered online. They are especially active during the holidays when more and more people are ordering online.

Protect Your Packages: Tips to Prevent Porch Theft

Install Cameras and Video Doorbells


- A visible camera can deter thieves.
- Recorded footage helps identify suspects and provides proof for vendors or police.
- Use Motion-Sensor Lights
- Bright, motion-activated lights can startle thieves.
- They also draw attention to unusual activity on your porch.
- Invest in a Package Lockbox
- Built with durable, secure materials.
- Requires a code to open, keeping packages safe until you retrieve them.
- Secure Delivery Options

Ship to a Secure Location

- Deliver to your office, a trusted neighbor, an Amazon Locker, or a P.O. Box.
- Use In-Store Pickup
- For retailers with physical stores, pick up your order at the counter.
- Request a Signature
- Ensures your package is handed directly to you or an authorized recipient.

Be Proactive

- Track Your Packages
- Sign up for delivery notifications to know exactly when to expect your order.
- Ask for Neighborly Help
- Have a trusted neighbor keep watch or pick up packages for you.
- Use Delivery Instructions
- Request drivers place packages in a hidden spot or behind a gate.

Water Conservation



Be a Water Warrior!

The City would like to remind residents about the year-round watering restrictions that are in place for water conservation efforts. Please be sure to share this information with relatives, friends and neighbors to help with lawn irrigation.

During Daylight Saving Time (Spring Forward) the following restrictions apply for Reclaimed Water (Residential and Commercial)

Residential with ODD or NO address - watering may only occur on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday


Residential with EVEN address - watering may only occur on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday

Non-residential watering may only occur on Tuesday and Friday

THERE IS NO WATERING BETWEEN 10 AM AND 4 PM

These restrictions apply to all municipal water users, including alternative, surface, reclaimed and potable water users.

Grease and Oil poured down the drain is the #1 cause of public sewer line failures. The City of Oviedo has a *Fats, Oils and Grease ordinance* to ensure that commercial businesses are equipped with necessary systems to ensure proper disposal. The City recommends that residents **DO NOT** pour fats and waste oil down household drains.



Hot Water and detergent do not break up grease and oil. As soon as it hits cold water in sewer lines, it solidifies and clings to the pipe walls.



Liquid Oil solidifies when it cools.



The garbage disposal does not break down oils and grease.

Pour excess grease and oil into the garbage can (when it is cool enough to do so)

Pour excess grease and oil into a can or jar and dispose of it at the Seminole County Transfer Station.






